

² Thrive! sculpture is to be interacted with and gently touched. Some are copper, wood or both. Sizes range from a foot to dozen feet. Some make sounds when moved by wind or people; some remain silent. Some move physically; some move conceptually. All generate shadows, a second image.

The call to artists and people generally is to embrace both art and advocacy, use their synergy, and advance toward a thriving future for all forever.

Advanced by the art are mission-driven values - creating and sustaining large positive change and a thriving future, reducing human vulnerability, maximizing human potential, saving our environment, and living at peace on and with the earth. Underlying it all is the driving desire to "build a thriving future for all forever", as best as we as people can.

Toward that end, Thrive! sculpture help drive toward a positive vision of the future. They portray strong driving forces -- the desire for knowledge, spirit and justice. High level thought, being, and positive interrelationships are not ends but new foundations from which progress springs. The sculpture supports the continuous striving for absolute knowledge, absolute spirit and perfected being with full recognition this is an inevitable, unending, inspiring and liberating human enterprise.

To achieve the vision, they also help explore threats of vulnerability, conflict, and chaos. The mobiles and stabiles address these threats, glean whatever positives they contain, and advocate major progression from these threats -- large, positive, sustainable change.

Positive, progressive change has many expressions -- becoming, ascending, quantum leaps, and achieving a high state of being. Change itself is often not positive or linear. Vulnerability, conflict and chaos are realities. Such change requires strong and continuing support -- shepherding, nurturing, sheltering, and uplifting.

To create the progressive art, the mobiles and stabiles are created from the most basic of elements. Lines represent beginning, negative, or threat. Curves represent change, transition, or evolution. Circles represent being, wholeness, or, at times, nothingness.

When these basic elements join and are in motion as mobiles and stabiles, they carry the message of "large, creative and sustainable change," a strong optimistic expression of the human condition, living in peace on and with the earth, and the driving mission of building a thriving future for all forever.

"Vulnerable!" sculpture symbolize the need to minimize vulnerability. We, including our family and friends, our communities and our world need to minimize vulnerability now and for the near and long term future.

"Create!" sculpture. Much of the early sculpture by GChris focuses on human creativity and human potential. An early phase focuses on "creatures" representing a creative and abstract view of non-human creatures. Creatures known as "Whimseys" were a major theme of GChris sculpture. A parallel phase focuses on human potential and how to develop, maximize and optimize that potential for the greater good. Thrive! is the theme that most characterizes "create" sculpture.








Thought - 2 Thrive! for all forever lays out our challenge "to build and sustain a thriving future for all forever".

Sculpture - absolute spirit, 3' x 3', wood & metal stabile


all important









Sculpture - bordering on the edge of freedom, 3' x 4', wood and metal stabile


breathe


code red for Earth

Sculpture – community raising, 3' x 3', metal mobile




conscientious objection

Thought - as earth loses more and more of its vital oxygen, earth's oxygen-breathing creatures slowly suffocate.
